Coldcut have assembled what seems like most of the Ninja Tune recording roster. So on any given night you can expect sets from them that are bound to make this one of the busiest Thursday nights in the capital, including the likes of Mr Scruff, Amon Tobin, Vadim, Funki Porcini and Chocolate Weasel. However the 333 is the new venue for this night from June. Which should prove to be more suitable, as Turnmills was bursting to capacity on the opening night, making for an uncomfortable journey from room to room.
